

## **FSFN GUIDE TO SAFETY PLANS**


**Step 1:** After logging into FSFN, locate the case name and click on the **Case Book** hyperlink.



**Step 2:** On the Case Book screen, locate and click on the **Safety Plan** hyperlink. FSFN allows for up to TWO (2) safety plans per child.



**Step 3:** If there are no safety plans created, simply click on the CREATE button to continue. If there are other safety plans created for the case, you may select the radial button pertaining to the Household name to copy over information.



**Step 4:** On the **Safety Plan screen**, complete the following.

Number	What needs to be done in this area?
1	Type a unique name identifier for the household so that you may readily recognize it on other FSFN screens.
2	Insert the <u>date</u> that the safety plan is in effect; select the children for whom this safety plan is being created.
3	Using the dropdown options, select which <u>type of safety plan</u> is being created (Impending or Present Danger).
4	In the Danger Threats Description, type the <u>specific danger threat(s)</u> to the child from the 11 Danger Threats. Be sure to include a <u>brief description explaining</u> how the danger threat relates to this particular child/family. <b>Example:</b> The father (Joe Smith) struck the mother (Gladys Smith) in the face during a domestic dispute. The child not only
	witnessed the violence but was subsequently pushed to the ground by the father during the event.
5	Click on the <b>Insert</b> button to add specific <u>action steps</u> to control for the danger threat. Click Insert for each additional safety action.


**Step 5:** On the **Safety Action Plan screen**, complete all four sections thoroughly.




## Important things to remember:

- Safety Actions <u>must control</u> for the danger threat.
- Only <u>responsible adults</u> are able to control for danger. Parents with diminished caregiver protective capacities have already demonstrated they cannot control for the danger threat, so <u>DO NOT</u> place them responsible in the safety plan.
- Safety Actions are not Case Plan Tasks; however, they require **commitment** from those placed to control for danger.
- Safety Actions are not promissory! The statement "if you do this, we can promise this" is 100% false.
- CPI/Case Management <u>must monitor</u> the safety plan to ensure it is controlling the danger; if the safety plan is not functioning, work with the family to create one that will control the danger.

Step 6: The Safety Plan Actions allow for the ability to customize the viewing of specific actions. If you have created actions that control for the danger threat(s) but should only be known by the survivor of intimate partner violence, check the box entitled DO NOT SHARE WITH PERPETRATOR OF INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE. If actions are checked, those actions will not appear on the safety plan when utilizing the Safety Plan hyperlink.




**Step 7:** Under the Text Section, click on the desired **Safety Plan** hyperlink to populate/print the safety plan.



**Step 8:** Word will generate the Safety Plan. Please remember to have everyone involved sign the safety plan and upload the signature page.



**Step 9:** To terminate a safety plan, check the completed box, enter a termination date, and select a reason the plan is no longer necessary from the dropdown options.
